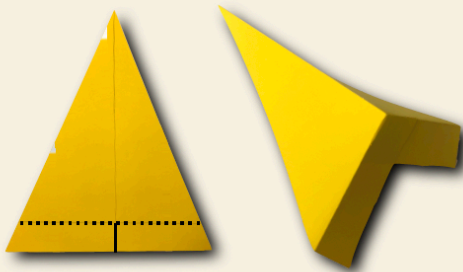


Be prepared to demonstrate the following paper sculpture techniques to help the children create ears, beaks, horns and trunks, etc., on their box sculptures. You will notice that most of these techniques involve creating forms from shapes. Using construction paper or manila tag, prepare a finished example of each before class. Cut an additional shape for each so that you can demonstrate how to make the forms during class.

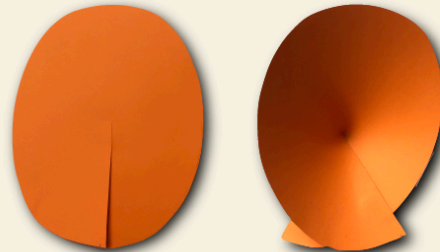
1. Cut a circle and remove a wedge shape. Join the edges to create a cone.



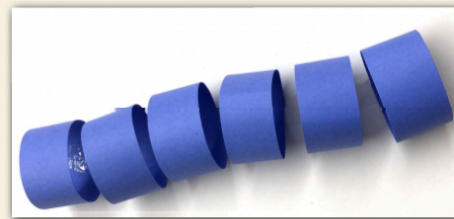
2. Cut a triangle. Cut a slit on the solid line (from the straight edge to the dotted line), and fold on the dotted line. Then fold lengthwise. Such a form could serve as part of a beak.



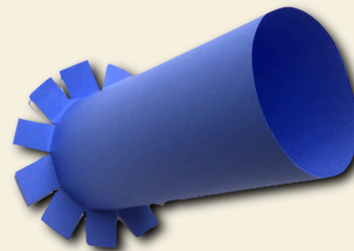
3. Cut a circle or oval. Cut a slit from the outer edge to the center and overlap the edges to form an ear.



4. Cut rectangular strips and join them to form loops, or make the loops by cutting a paper roll into segments. Join the loops with tape to make a swinging trunk or a tail.



5. Snip the edge of a paper roll and turn up the snipped edge to join the cylinder to another surface.



- Cut a 6" x 6" square.
- Plug in glue gun immediately prior to the beginning of class.
